"The climbing rope stretches out like a wire cable due to the wind. The summit is reached at 3 a.m. on the 25^{th} of May, 1963. The summit party is able to observe the high point of our former attempt two days before, turned back while climbing into the big storm. That high point appears to be about 50 yards short of the summit. The temperature is estimated at -20 degree Fahrenheit, and it is exceedingly windy. We are all pleased that the expedition has made a successful ascent of Denali."




















