

of fourth to fifth-class climbing led up left to a large ledge area. From this we followed an inside corner for 600 feet. The last two leads were of very difficult fifth-class jams and laybacks.

STEPHEN ARSENAULT, *Harvard Mountaineering Club*

*Wallace Peak, Vowell Group, South Ridge.* From a camp on the east side of the Vowell group, Jim Alt, Volker Vogt and I walked to the small col below the south ridge. From there the initial pitches consisted of moderate fifth-class climbing with some aid. We continued up to the right, following the solid rock to the summit ridge.

*Eastpost Spire, New South Face Route.* On July 29 Gay Campbell, Phil Nelson, Pete Zvengrowski and I climbed this route with Gay in the lead. The climb began in a prominent corner west of the Kor route. Hard climbing, where it was difficult to place pitons in shallow, dirt-filled cracks, and a traverse with a layback on an underhold led to a sling belay. Another free pitch led to an overhang and another sling belay. The next lead, to the right of the overhang, began with difficult direct-aid nailing behind expanding flakes and finished with a short free section. From here we scrambled up a huge loose chimney and the summit block. We graded the climb F7, A3.

STAN FUKA, *Simians*

*Climbs in Bill's Pass Area.* There are a number of prominent pinnacles on the ridges southwest of Bill's Pass, which were apparently unclimbed. On August 2 Gay Campbell, Lorrie Hough, Stan Fuka and I climbed one of them, the highest or second highest point on the ridge south of Juniper Lake. The lower rock was rotten, but it was good higher up and there were several excellent fifth-class pitches, the hardest being F6. We were rewarded on top by a magnificent view of Howser's west face.

PETER ZVENGROWSKI, *Simians*

*Mount Stone, Conrad Group.* This attractive 9990-foot snow peak southwest of Mount Conrad, previously unclimbed, was the goal of our group from the Simian Climbing Club (Laura Jasch, Bill Knowler, Gretchen Schoenbohm, and Curt Wagner). From Boulder Camp in the Bugaboos, we placed a second camp just beyond Bill's Pass. Before reaching Juniper Lake, we made a steep descent into the valley of the
