Munich, Germany were trucked up to the Llanganuco Lakes and headed toward the Portachuelo, leaving the pack trail where it crosses the drainage from Huascarán and Chopicalqui. Camp I was in this valley at 14,500 feet and II at the top of the west moraine of the Chopicalqui glacier. Our high camp was just below the ridge at 18,500 feet. On July 9 Mattox, Herrmann and Denk made a second attempt and reached the summit (20,998 feet) in the early afternoon. New snow and unsettled weather forced us to abandon plans for the ascent of Chopicalqui, and of other peaks, by the remainder of the team.

Chopicalqui and Huascarán. An all-ladies party was led by Fukimo Ogura and composed of Naoko Moritani, Taeko Yanagishita, Misako Kobuna, Takako Suzuki, Mioko Suga and Onorat. After failing to climb San Juan in late May, all climbed Chopicalqui from the Quebrada Ulta via the southwest ridge on June 28. Moritani, Yanagishita and Kobuna climbed Huascarán on July 14 and the others on the 17th. After a trek up the Quebrada Santa Cruz and down the Huaripampa and Llanganuco, they helped with the rescue of the Kanazawa University party on Chacraraju.

Chinchey and Ayukaraju. Shinichi Takizawa led this expedition. Base Camp was established on July 7 on Pucaranracocha at 13,775 feet. On July 21 Ichie Komiyama, Takeshi Yabunami, Taneshi Kaneko, Masatoshi Toda and Takeo Nezu climbed Chinchey (20,413 feet) from the Pucaranra col. On July 30 they made the second ascent of Ayukaraju (18,527 feet), which lies north of Chinchey. After hearing of the accident on Chacraraju to the Kanazawa University group, they went to join the rescue party.

Chacraraju Este Attempt, Cordillera Blanca and Peaks in Cordilleras Raura and Yauyos. The Kanazawa University Alpine Club expedition was composed of Toshimitsu Wada, leader, Kazumasa Kawachi, Masando Tanaka, Kasumaza Kochi and three others. They first entered the Cordillera Raura, where they climbed Condorcenca (17,454 feet) on June 4, Santa Rosa (18,758 feet) on June 6, Yarupa (18,725 feet) and Yarupa Norte (18,406 feet) on June 8. They next entered the Cordillera Yauyos, climbing Cotoní (19,086 feet) on June 25, Altarnio (17,586 feet; first ascent) on June 27, Llongote (18,966 feet) on June 30 and Quepala (17,586 feet) on July 4. They then moved to the Cordillera Blanca. On July 13 they climbed Huascarán Norte and on the 25th Pisco Este.
