and the total time on the mountain, eight. This previously unclimbed mountain lies two kilometers north of Condoriri.

Peaks near Condoriri, Cordillera Real. Mitchell Anderson, Phineas Anderson, Lorelei Bode, Roman Laba and I spent a week between Zongo Pass and Mina Palcoco. We left Zongo on July 22 and having passed Estancia Coscapa on the 23rd, we camped just south of Cerro Rincón at the base of Condoriri on the 24th. On the 25th we climbed to the col between Condoriri and an unnamed, unclimbed P 5400 (17,717 feet), which I soloed. On the 26th Anderson, Laba and I climbed the west face of another unnamed, unclimbed P 5400, immediately southeast of the peak I had climbed the previous day and southeast of Cerro Balcón. On the 27th we passed Mina Fabulosa and camped on the north of Apacheta Pass. On July 28 all but I climbed a new route, the south face, of BAE 30 (17,704 feet), northwest of the pass.

Haucaña, Cordillera Real. A South African expedition approached the Ancohuma massif from Milibaya. They went by road to the 13,000-foot Mina San Antonio, southeast of the Milibaya road and followed a trail for a mile to the glacier which descends from the plateau west of Ancohuma's summit. Because of fog, they ascended the right fork of the glacier which climbs southeast to a 18,375-foot pass at the foot of Haucaña's south ridge. On June 22 Thomas Choate, P. Sweet and W. Krog climbed the steep south ridge to the summit of Haucaña (20,360 feet). The next day Choate and P. Campbell traversed two 19,000-foot peaks from the pass to reach the summit of Pirámide (19,357 feet), the highest peak at the south corner of the Ancohuma group.

Peaks in the Cordilleras Apolobamba and Real. The Jubilee Expedition of the Schorndorf Section of the German Alpine Club had as members Ernst Dreiseitel, Rolf Gölz, Ernst Henninger, Siegfried Härer, Ulrich Jaudas, Wolfgang Lutz, Richard Reif, and me as leader. Our outstanding achievements were the new route climbed on Pelechuco Huaracha, the southwest ridge, and the traverse of Haucaña and Ancohuma. Unfortunately on July 7 Henninger was killed during an unsuccessful attempt on Ancohuma's south face, when the bridge over the randkluft (moat) collapsed. We arrived at the Pelechuco Pass in the Cordillera Apolobamba on June 14. We made the following climbs: P 5330 (17,487 feet; BJE 2), 2nd ascent by new route, southwest face, and traverse to P 5300 (17,389 feet; BJE 1) by F. and R. Gölz, Lutz, Siemers and P 5300 (17,389 feet; BJE 3) by Härer, Henninger, Dreiseitel, Jaudas, Reif, all three on June 15; P 5300 (17,389 feet; OAE 1) by Dreiseitel, F. and R. Gölz, Jaudas, Reif on June 16; after an unsuccessful attempt on P 5550, P 5450 (17,881
