Curt Saville, my wife and I had landed on the island and climbed P 4064 a few miles up the previously unexplored Narsarsuk Glacier (C.A.J., 1975: pp 95-98). This year we returned in the spring and traveled from Pond Inlet by komatik and skidoo. Using mountaineering skis and pulling small fiberglass sledges, we ascended the Narsarsuk Glacier to its head about 10 miles inland and also made first ascents of two peaks, P 5332 at 73°0′30″N; 76°26″W and Pc. 5100 at 72°58′30″N; 77°25′W (Map Reference Canada NTS 1:500,000 Pond Inlet.) GREENLAND

Palup Peak, Upernivik Island, West Greenland. In June, after Giorgio Pettigiani, Enrico Bologna and I had climbed Gauntlet Peak in the Weasel Valley on Baffin Island by the normal route, Pettigiani and I flew to Umanak in Greenland and went by boat to Upernivik Island, where we climbed Palup Peak (2101 meters, 6893 feet) from the Qungulertunsup Glacier, probably a new route up the north face and west ridge.

Akuliaruseq Peninsula, West Greenland. Franco Alletto, Giuseppe Cazzaniga. Giancarlo Del Zotto, Bruno Gabaglio, Fabio and Mariola Masciandri and I were active on the north coast of the Akuliarusea peninsula in July. From Base Camp on the coast, where a glacier runs down into Kangigdleq Fjord, we climbed a rocky 1300-foot wall to get to the upper part of the valley. On July 4, from Camp I at 2300 feet, Cazzaniga, Del Zotto, Alletto and I climbed a long, crevassed glacier. Via the north face and northwest ridge, we got to the summit of Nunupniaga (2200 meters, 7218 feet; 10 miles northeast of Snepyramiden), which commands a view over Kangerlugssuag Fjord. On July 7 Cazzangia, Gabaglio, Fabio Masciadri and I climbed Timumanikavsa (1780 meters, 5840 feet). On July 8 to 10 Alletto and I crossed a 2600-foot pass to get to the upper part of the Nerdlerit valley. After crossing moraines and glaciers we got to the 1963 Belgian camp on the Snepyramiden. From there, rather than continuing the descent to the sea, we turned north and after climbing a pass, followed down the Oordlortossuag to reach the sea.
